
Recent Observations

August 2023

- Above average rainfall received over the Niuas, Vava'u and Ha'apai. (see table below)
- Below average rainfall over Tongatapu during August.
- The mean air temperature was 22.6°C which was 0.9°C cooler than average.
- Lowest minimum temperature was 12.5°C recorded on the 30th at Hango, 'Éua.





ENSO Update



El Niño Alert continues, with El Niño development likely during September to December period. When El Niño Alert criteria have been met in the past, an El Niño event has developed around 70% of the time.

Sea surface temperatures (SSTs) in the tropical Pacific are exceeding El Niño thresholds, with climate models indicating this is likely to continue at least through to early 2024.
